Job Purpose: Under the direction of the Behavioral Health (BH) Director, the Behavioral Health Integration Care Coordinator (BHICC) will serve as a liaison between patients and BH Providers, as well as be part of a multidisciplinary team at Sonoma County Indian Health Project, Inc. (SCIHP). The BHICC will: collaborate with the Supervising LCSW to support BH Providers in creating individual patient treatment plans; clinical case work; provide brief solution focused interventions; conduct clinical screening, intake, and psychosocial assessments; and triage for acuity and engagement. The BHICC is the first contact between SCIHP patients and the BH Department when engaging psychosocial and substance use services. The BHICC will be involved in an integrated system of care in development of a holistic and trauma-informed care that is culturally responsive and culturally appropriate to SCIHP patients.

Qualifications:

- Bachelor's Degree in a Behavioral Health related discipline (psychology, social work, substance abuse counseling).
- Intermediate to advanced experience with Microsoft Office Suite, particularly Word, Excel and Power Point.
- Excellent communication, reporting and interpersonal skills.
- Ability to work independently and meet deadlines while also being an effective team member and collaborating with the agency-wide management team.
- Ability to provide compassionate care.
- Conflict resolution and de-escalation skills.
- Understanding of California mandated reporting laws.
- Hold a current valid California Driver's License, have a safe driving record, and be insurable.
- Must pass a pre-employment drug screen, physical and background investigation.

Special Qualifications: Must be sensitive to the needs of the Native American Community, which includes their culture, traditions, behavioral patterns, and background.
